Learning Disabilities

A learning disability is an impairment of neurological origin that impacts specific areas of learning.

- A **sequencing disorder** is difficulty with the order of a series of things. It may lead to problems with prioritising, doing maths or following instructions.
- **Language disorders** are difficulties with understanding and remembering.
- **Visual disorders** are difficulties with processing information visually leading to problems with reading, spelling & writing.
- **Auditory disorders** are difficulties with processing sounds, such as distinguishing words that sound similar.
- **Memory disorder** is a difficulty retrieving certain information from memory within a reasonable time.
- **Gross/Fine motor disorders** interfere with coordination, including handwriting.

With your support and small adaptations, students with learning disabilities can be successful in the workplace.
